

Pulham St Mary Platinum Path

This is a mainly off-road walk following public rights of way footpaths, with just two sections on very quiet country lanes.

The start point is by the gate at the east side St Mary's Church, Footpath 15.

From the Church gate you head up the track past the houses on your right-hand side and as you pass the last house you turn right following the footpath, turning left as you enter the small wooded area.

Follow Footpath 15 past the grazing land and out through the kissing gate. Turn right following the field edge until you come around to the bottom corner of Kemps Road and then turn right and stay on Kemps Road to the top corner.

Look out for the finger post at the top corner of Kemps Road as this leads you back off road. This is Footpath 11, that if followed is the short cut across to Footpath 13, but if you are doing the full walk turn immediately left as you go through the gap in the hedge and you will be on Footpath 9.

Follow the field edge until you see a way marker post taking you through a gap over 2 bridged drainage ditches out onto an unmade track. Go to the right following the track and you will see a second way marker post on a bridged ditch. Follow the yellow arrow marker and you are now on Footpath 5. Follow the field edge and this takes you onto Lonely Road.

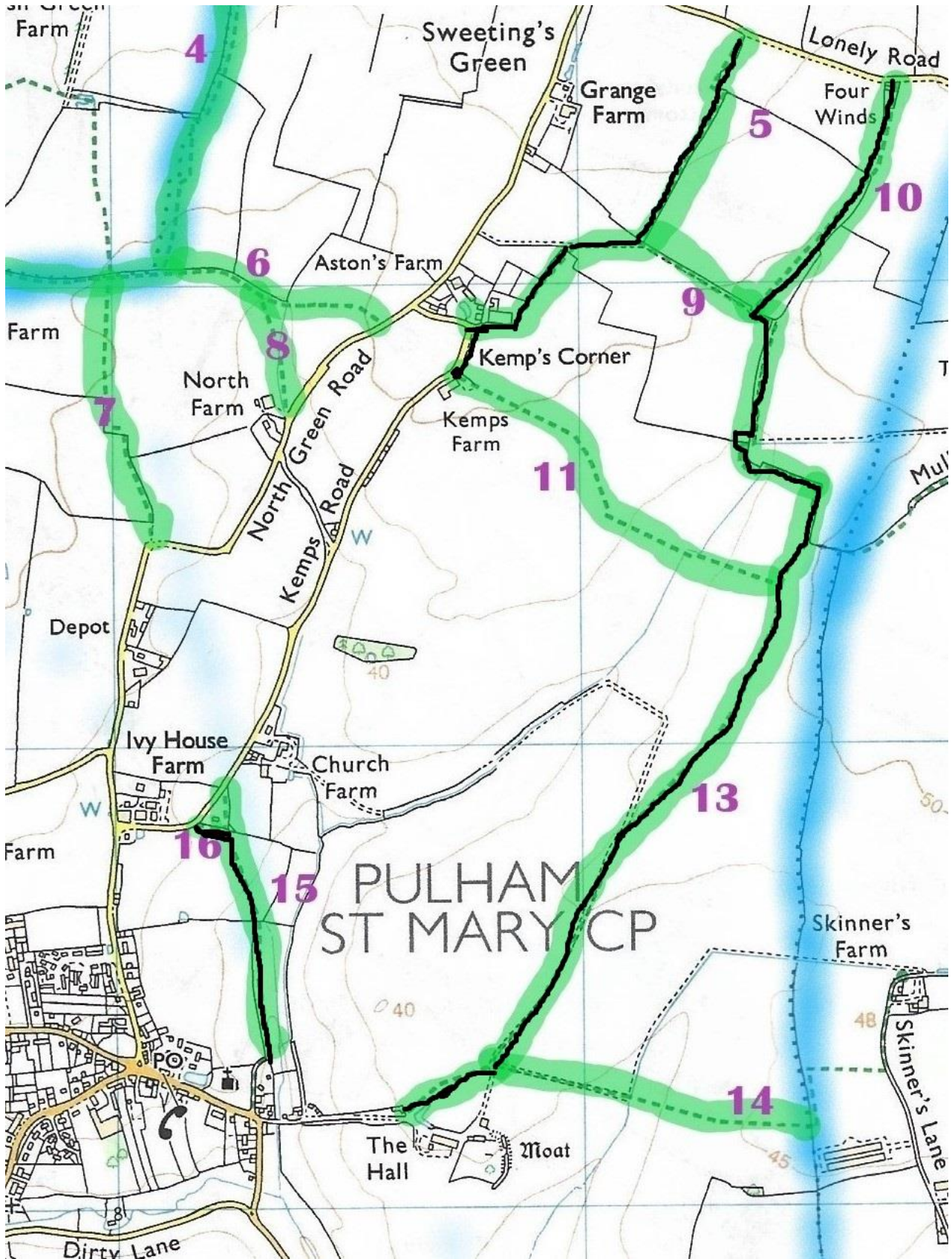
Turn right onto Lonely Road and after 400 metres you pass a cottage called Four Winds where you will see a finger post with a yellow arrow turning you right onto Footpath 10. Follow Footpath 10 down the side of the house and garden and then follow the field edge until you see the next way marker again on a bridged ditch. Follow the yellow arrow marker across and walk along the field edge until you see the next way marker post. You are now back on Footpath 9. Follow the yellow direction arrow up to the next way marker post and this will turn you to the right again. Follow the field edge to the next way marker post.

Again, follow the yellow direction marker and you will soon see the next way marker post taking you through a gap in the hedge, over a bridged ditch. Once through the gap look for the next way marker post and follow the direction arrow that leads you along the field edge to the next way marker post.

This post now points across the field which is now Footpath 13 and you will see the farmer has left a well-defined path through the crops. About 100 metres along into the field you will see Footpath 11 meets Footpath 13. This is the shortcut across from the top of Kemps Road mentioned earlier.

Stay on Footpath 13. This meets an unmade track where you turn left and follow the track heading towards Hall Farm. Just past the large haystack, you will see a way marker post

taking you across a field to the top of Hall Lane and this takes you back to the Church and the finish of what I hope you have found to be a very enjoyable walk.



Walk time at steady pace roughly 1 ¾ hours. Please follow all good country code practices.
