Trustees are pleased to report that we have been able to award more than £1700 in grants so far this year. We have helped a student with the cost of a laptop and also Pulham School with their garden project. We continue to support the Parish Church and in recognition of the present financial difficulties facing many people, we have increased the amount given in Christmas gifts to 14 residents.

The advertisement for the Town Estate Charity in the Parish Magazine, along with those for Pulham Market, has now been included in the newsletters for parents of schools in the Harleston School Cluster and Pulham School will be adding the grant application form to their website, making it easier for parishioners to ask for help.

A small strip of land in Station Road which has been leased to neighbouring residents for over 50 years, has now been registered in their name in return for them bearing all the costs of the registration. This land was previously unregistered and we are pleased that the Charity no longer has responsibility for its maintenance.
